

Robert Oelsner, MD, PsyA-FIPA is a training and supervising analyst on the faculty of the Northwestern Psychoanalytic Society in Seattle, and the Buenos Aires Psychoanalytic Association. He is also on the faculty of the Psychoanalytic Institute of Northern California. Robert is an IPA certified child and adolescent psychoanalyst and a Clinical Associate Professor at the UW Department of Child Psychiatry. He is in private practice in Seattle with children, adolescents and adults.

Janine Sternberg, is a consultant child & adolescent psychotherapist, working at the Portman Clinic, part of the Tavistock & Portman NHS Foundation Trust. She trained originally as a child psychotherapist at the Tavistock and then as an adult psychotherapist with the BAP. She supervises and teaches child psychotherapists in all the London child psychotherapy trainings. She is author of *'Infant Observation at the Heart of Training'* (Karnac 2005) and co-editor (with Cathy Urwin) of *'Infant Observation and Research: Emotional Processes in Everyday Lives*' which is due out in 2012.


